### SERMON STUDY

Read these verses before you begin your discussion: Luke 15:11-32

Have you ever been hurt by someone so significantly that later, if he or she asked for forgiveness, you delayed in giving it to him or her? After reading about how the father ran toward his son to forgive him, would you be able to do the same thing?

We're all prodigals in some sense—we have all rebelled and spent until we had nothing left. Some of us have strayed from home, and some of us have stayed home—following, serving, and remaining faithful yet becoming burned out or lost. Which son are you? What brother do you identify with more? What can you do right now to join God's party and come back to him in true rest?

Jesus doesn't tell us the response of either brother because we're the ones who need to respond. What is God calling you to do in response to this story from Jesus?

Need a review of what we're reading in Daily Bible Reading? Here's a glance at what we're being challenged with this week.

Day one: Luke 15:11-16 | Which son do you relate to the most?

Day two: Luke 15:17-21 | No matter what you've done or what you will do, nothing can make God love you more or less.

Day three: Luke 15:22-30 | Do you expect God to see people in the same way you see them?

Day four: Luke 15:31-32 | How are you challenged to love people today more like God loves people?

Day five: Luke 15:11-31 | What do you notice that you didn't notice earlier? What is God teaching you through this passage? How will you respond?
